According to Robin Dunbar the centrepiece of the Neolithic is “the invention” of “mechanisms” that allowed people to live together without killing each other. In the preceding meeting, on May 1st, a model was outlined to suggest that the creation of “humankind (‘Adam and Eve’) in the image of God” (Genesis 1:26-27; 9:6) took place in the Neolithic. The prohibition of murder in Genesis 9:3-6 “for in the image God has God made humankind” recalls the “mechanisms” Dunbar refers to.

The aim of the present meeting is:

- On the one hand to discuss models that date Adam and Eve long before the Neolithic (200,000-40,000 BP).
- On the other hand to discuss further arguments in favor of the thesis that Adam and Eve lived in the Neolithic, and in particular to show the relevance of the Flood narrative in this respect.
